


# 2006 AOSLA COURSES

The entire international course faculty was very impressed with the organization of this event, so impressed that they are planning to have yet another one in Latin America sometime next year. They have received favorable feedback from all courses participants concerning the organization. AOSLA's regional office is hopeful that the high quality of the courses and seminaries will be well propagated throughout the entire AOSpine community and that Latin America will be even more recognized internationally.

This course envisioned the interaction of experienced spine surgeons with the intent to improve their knowledge in controversial complex issues concerning spine surgery. The course was based in case presentations and case discussions, involving the participants and faculties through ARS. The presented cases illustrated complex spine problems, including trauma, degenerative disease, deformities as well as tumors. Short lectures served as base to facilitate the discussion of topics with the participants.

At the end of this course the participants were able to:

- -Discuss latest advancements in controversial treatment in complex cases of spine surgery.
- -Describe and to demonstrate AO's principals for spine surgery trauma, deformities, degenerative diseases and tumors.
- -Interpret diagnostic problems concerning treatment of complex spine diseases.

The Complex Spinal Issues course was very high evaluated by its participants; participants which came from various parts of Brazil and other countries as well. Countries such as Argentina, Ecuador, Mexico and Peru, causing Costão do Santinho's auditorium to be filled with participants eager to watch the discussion of complex clinical cases and controversial studies concerning the spine area. The course program, consisted of short lectures, which allowed a very intense participation from the audience, both audience and faculty were able to interact through ARS (automated response system). A very special characteristic of this course was the fact that the AOSLA office organized the entire event, allowing it to be as scientific as possible, counting on the endorsement from the Brazilian Spine Society and the Brazilian Orthopedics Oncology Society.

One of the highlights of the event was the presentation of the international group of experts in tumor from AOSpine, known as AOSTEG (AOSpine Tumor Experts Group). This group is formed by internationally known surgeons who presented their experience in the treatment of tumor lesions in the spine through lectures by Drs. Roberto Biagini (Italy), Dr Gautam Zaveri (India), Dr Norio Kawahara (Japan), Drs. Laurence Rhines and Ehud Mendel (United States), and also of Dr Peter Paul Varga (Hungary). In a meeting after the course, this group of surgeons that along with the participation of Dr. Luiz Roberto Vialle (Brazil), established parameters for a research group studying spine tumors.

The Florianopolis course was a very unique event, counting with the presence of greatly experienced surgeons from various countries that generated productive discussions with a highest scientific caliber. The format in which the lectures were presented, brought out great interest from the audience, the lectures most certainly brought an impact on their daily practices, stated Emiliano Vialle, course Director in agreement with Drs. Paulo Cavali and Marcelo Gruenberg.



The main objective of the course is to analyze most frequent lesions of the vertebral spine, both degenerative and traumatic, since its etiology, diagnosis of surgical and conservative treatment; they were able to expose different approaches and implants. The course program covered very problematic areas the can be observed on their daily practices assuring that the results of all techniques will be reflected within the wellbeing of all of their patients.

This course had an outstandingly positive outcome; the number of participants exceeded the number of places available for registrants, and the case discussion sessions were very efficient, especially during the tequila discussion session, where most of the participants felt comfortable in sharing their personal experience in some of the cases discussed during this session. Not only was this the very first AOSLA's Education Committee meeting for AOSLA Education; but it was also where all of AOSLA's committee council members had the opportunity to meet their colleagues from all of our Latin American Countries chapters personally, and present briefly each of their country diagnosis and expose the current education analysis. The outcomes for this meeting were the results of carefully conducted workshops where both groups had the opportunity to propose and vote upon projects for AOSLA's Education Committee to become effective for 2007's calendar. On top of standardized and specific requirements for faculty members, and interesting idea was born. Project "Cirque du Soleil – Saltimbancos", reoccurring traveling seminaries throughout; same topics seminaries that could be repeated throughout different regions according to the localities educational needs, and also based on day to day cases, complications, and regional interest topics. The meeting resulted in assignments for all Education Committee members that were to be finalized at AOSLA's Strategic Meeting in Recife.

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AOSLA Research June 02-03, 2006 Curitiba, Brazil Pestana Hotel

During the AOSLA Research Committee meeting in Curitiba, the council members were able to share the current research situation for each of their respective countries. Through carried group discussions the councils were able to discuss and vote on possible studies for the very first AOSpine Latin America Research project, and Dr. Alvarado who is our Research representative on the AOSLA's Board was happy to inform the group that we would count on the assistance from AOCID (AO Clinical Investigation & Documentation) and we would also have the visit from AOCID's Project manager, Isabel Diterich during our Strategic Meeting in Recife, which would be where they would further discuss the Research goals and protocol of possible studies in Latin America for 2007.

AOSLA Sci Marketing July 14-15, 2006 Curitiba, Brazil Pestana Hotel

The Scientific Marketing Committee meeting that occurred in Curitiba was very productive. This was the first time all of our Sci Mkt Officers councils for all Latin American chapters were able to discuss some main objectives for these



council members to act upon in order to meet their specific goals for 2007. Two groups were separated to come up with answers for the following topics: Membership; Alliances; Corporate Identity and our Webpage. For each specific topic the group had come up with interesting suggestions on how to act upon them; personalized webpages, more lounges during AOSpine courses and seminaries as well as a word of mouth approach to increase membership were suggested, seeking local societies and universities with the same scientific and educational philosophy was suggested as AOSpine Alliances; personalized webpages in local languages, news and access rewards were proposed. However, it was the "points system" idea that broke the boundaries for AOSpine Latin America and caught AOSpine International special attention.


