# ▶ Chairperson's Word

Dear AOSpine friends,

It is an honor to be elected as Chair of the AOSLA Board. Thank you for the opportunity to work with you for the next three years. It is a great responsibility to be able to further increase the accomplishments of AOSpine Latin America.

I would like to congratulate the previous Chairs of the Board: Roberto Chapa, Osmar Moraes, Marcelo Gruenberg, and Luiz Vialle for the excellence of their work and vision.

The greatest strength of this institution is "YOU", a competent and qualified team that has the intrinsic motivation to work together. Success is the result of the work of many people: Board, Office, Chapters, Faculty, AOSpine members, and partnerships. Therefore, I wish to invite you to bring your innovative ideas and efforts to take AOSpine Latin America one step further.

The action points planned for the next three years are as follows: (I) to implement a TEAM approach: Transparent, Egalitarian, Accountable,

and Meritocratic in order to increase the transparency of what we do; (II) to develop clear rules and prerequisites to be involved in AOSLA education and research activities; (III) to clearly define the AOSLA process to become a local, regional, and international faculty, Chairperson, and education advisor; (IV) to improve communication between the Chapters, Board, and Office; and (V) to increase the face-to-face and online educational activities.

The elections for the positions of AOSLA Education-elect, Community development, and Fellowships & Spine Centers were conducted at the beginning of the year appointing Nestor Taboada, Jaime Segura, and Emiliano Vialle, respectively, to begin their terms last July.

Moreover, I would like to highlight that Latin America spine surgeons are taking important positions within AO. For instance, Juan Emmerich is the new Champion of the Faculty Development and Management Task Force for AOSpine International. Furthermore, Emiliano Vialle and William Jacobsen Teixeira, respectively, were invited to be part of Trauma and Tumor Knowledge Forum.



In 2016, the academic activities featured 58 courses, symposia, and seminars with over 3.500 participants while the Advanced Online Courses had over 1.000 participants. In addition, the Continuing Education Program was updated to provide better active educational methodologies.

Finally, the 2016 Regional Courses in Bogota held in November 3–5, 2016 was a success with more than 200 participants. This event was a great opportunity to prepare us for the 2017 Regional Courses that will be in Mexico City on June 22–24. We suggest you "Save the date" for a further outstanding interaction with our international speakers: Richard Bransford, Michael Fehlings, Roger Härtl, Frank Kandziora, Jean Ouellet, Christopher Shaffrey, Alexander Vaccaro, and Jeffrey Wang.

2016 was a year of great achievements for AOSpine Latin America. The results will be presented in detail in the following sections.

During the year, we developed 64 courses in Latin America in the areas of principles and advanced courses, symposia, and modules on cadavers and anatomy, in addition to the already highly recognized virtual courses. We can proudly say that more than 3500 spine surgeons participated in our different events. This fantastic result would not have been possible without your precious help.

It is for me a great satisfaction, and at the same time a great challenge, to be elected as head of Community Development within the Latin America board, a position that I have worked in since July. In this first annual report of my term, rather than communicating the tasks performed, I would like to acknowledge the outstanding job of my predecessor, Dr. Samuel Pantoja, and Leonardo Peroni (project manager). Thanks to their work, we have finished the year with more than 1,400 members in 21 countries. 




### Membership evolution 2016




## ▶ Membership Retention 2016

### **▷CD** Initiatives

In education, communication has always been considered as a paramount element to spread knowledge. At AOSLA we are aware of this important element. This is why we implemented new instruments in order to improve internal and external communication.

At the internal level, AOSLA launched a forum for CD members of the chapters. The idea is to use this channel to increase cohesion between the activities in the countries and Headquarters.

In order to increase our communication channels with our external public, AOSLA has launched a newsletter that is published quarterly.

### ▶AOSLA Social Media

During 2016, AOSLA was very active in the Social Media with very good results. With a total of 1190 followers on Facebook, AOSLA increased its followers by 33% in less than a year. In November, the increase of followers on Twitter was 133%, passing from 250 followers in January to 583 in November.

Both instruments have been used to communicate news and events about AOSLA and its activities. In addition, our Facebook account has also been used to engage our public by publishing pictures of events in which they were participating.







## ▶ AOSpine Presence in Latin America

In 2016, AOSpine was able to organize and participate in a large number of events. This strategy, combined with an effective communication plan, brought an increase in the number of members that will take advantage of AOSpine benefits.

The support of the local chapters was essential for planning national events and to communicate them to the local public. The additional presence of international key opinion leaders in many of our events was a further factor that caught the attention of our public.

In addition to the traditional events, AOSLA has also participated with stands in several congresses and organized its first Regional Courses in Latin America.

## ▶ Research Officer's Word

Dear friends.

In 2016, "Education in Research" was the center of our efforts in AOSpine Latin America, which allowed us to turn our weaknesses into areas of opportunity and strengthen research in our region.

An example of such opportunities was our continuing education program that through online offers was improved and updated according to the needs of our members. The courses include all the didactic tools that were elaborated previously and explained in our book "From the idea to the Publication".

The success of this strategy led us to put together, in partnership with the other AO divisions (AOTrauma, AOVet and AOCMF), a course called AOne Research. The objective of the course is to share concepts, knowledge and methodology, in order to provide training in scientific knowledge in areas related to surgery, as well as its dissemination through high level impact scientific papers.

The high capacity and good production quality of scientific papers in our region is clear when we consider events such as the Dubai Global Spine Congress (2016), where 853 abstracts were received from all over the world – 8% from Latin America. Due to their quality, some of these articles were published in journals indexed with high impact factor.

In order to keep supporting research in our region, the AOSpine Latin America Research Award has been designed to reward the best 2017 Latin American paper submitted at the Global Spine Congress in Milan. Furthermore, the partnership with the AOSpine Research Commission started the program "Mentorship in Research".

This program will teach young surgeons the principles of clinical research. We hope these surgeons join the AOSpine research program in the future.

We are currently in the stage of editing a new book whose core topics are on Surgical Biostatistics. This book, called "From Measurement to Interpretation", is an instrument written to help understand each one of the statistical tests.

In 2016, Latin America was the region with the best score in productivity. In other words, research in Latin America is producing the best results related to financial investments. Because of these results, AOSLA was granted economic incentives that will be used in the remainder of this year in education and/or research activities.

In 2017, we will continue to seek strategies to produce instruments to enable the execution of research projects. One of these strategies will be the implementation of a "Global Database" to facilitate the gathering of multicentric projects and allow the analysis of data before the creation of ideas that can end up in a scientific paper.

I would like to express my appreciation and thanks to all the members of AOSpine team and fellow spine surgeons for their support, which allowed us to integrate all these actions towards a path where we clearly see a future full of great proposals and good results.

## ▶ Productivity Score

In 2016, the Research areas from the all regions had their 2015 research evaluated and given a productivity score. The evaluation aimed at providing transparency and accountability. The criteria were productivity in publications, presentations, book chapters, knowledge transfer activities and external grants. Points were assigned to each criterion and the total sum divided by the actual investment made in the region – the result is the final productivity score. Latin America is proud to be the region with the highest productivity score in 2015, which means that the research developed in our countries is creating the best results in comparison to the financial investments made here.

In recognition of the efforts devoted during 2015, in 2016, AOSpine Latin America received a CHF 30,000 "Reward for research productivity". AOSLA invested the money to create study groups launched during the AOSpine Latin America Regional Courses, held in Bogota in November 2016.

## ▶ Spine Centers Performance Report

The Spine Centers Performance Report is an initiative developed by the Fellowship and Spine Centers Commission in partnership with the Regional Board. The assessment will focus on the four following areas:




## ▶ Fellowship and Observership Programs





## ▶ Partnerships

### Partnership with Instituto Tecnológico y de Estudios Superiores de Monterrey and Universidade de Caxias do Sul

This year AOSLA signed cooperation agreements with Instituto Tecnológico y de Estudios Superiores de Monterrey (ITESM) and Universidade de Caxias do Sul (UCS) to support education on spine issues, by employing schools and scholars in the field of spine pathologies.

In order to participate in the process of applying for a Scholarship the candidate had to be a member of AOSpine for at least two consecutive years at the time of registration, and had to hold a diploma as Medical Doctor and as specialist in neurosurgery or orthopedics, and also to be available to carry out the activities involved in the research project.




